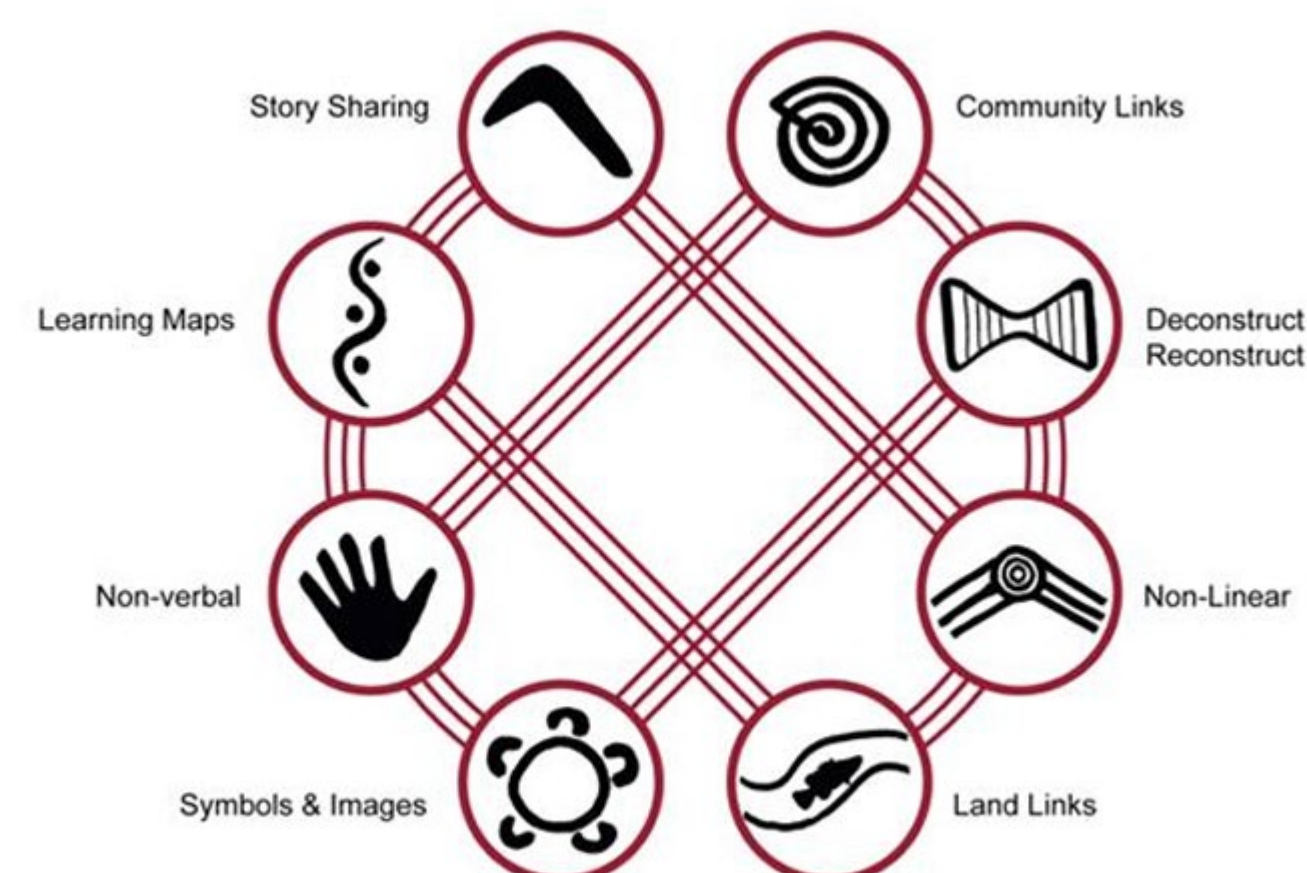


Figure 1: Yunkaporta's 8 Ways of Knowing' framework
