

## Research questions

- Has Australian governments' use of NCND evolved over time? How and why?
- 2. Has Australian governments' use of NCND historically been politically **partisan**?
- 3. What role has NCND played in Australian liberal democratic governance historically?



# Preliminary findings

- 1. Australian governments' use of NCND has **consistently evolved** to meet changing environments
- 2. Historically, NCND has increasingly **facilitated bipartisanship** on national security
- 3. NCND has played an **integral role** in Australian liberal democratic governance

### Benefits and future impact

- Historically-informed analysis of the role of national security secrecy within liberal democratic governance
- Identification of precedent for the use and adaptation of NCND
- Principled foundation for the navigation of national security secrecy in contemporary security environment
